Al is affecting our lives. Although it's new, some of the advantages it brings are <u>impressive</u>. <u>However, there are potential risks associated with Al that must be considered.</u>

A huge advantage of using Al is that it saves you time by doing tasks for you. Al can write hundreds of lines of code to build a website and help people write business documents and stories in just a few seconds. Another way Al helps students is that it is available 24/7. It's in a way like having your own personal tutor with you. Many students feel shy asking questions in class, but Al allows them to ask freely. Al can be used to fine-tune a search, so it only provides you with the most <u>relevant</u> information you need. For example, if you ask it to write an

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essay about digital marketing and you want more information about digital marketing on Facebook, Al can redo the task, but this time focus only on marketing with Facebook.

However, the use of Al has some certain drawbacks. One of the key concerns is the potential bias in the responses given by Al. In 2022, researchers at Stanford University found that Al generated toxic and biased language when responding to certain topics and phrases. Another potential risk of Al is that it could be used to create fake news, videos or other forms of media. This could be used to spread false information.

In brief, Al is likely to transform the way we interact with technology and save us time and effort in studies and work due to <u>its</u> efficiency, but it can also cause potential risks such as discriminatory language or the creation of fake news.

As we continue to face the impacts of climate change, having a green environment has become increasingly important to the future of our society. To achieve this, the world is shifting towards green energy, and two particular types of energy at the centre of this movement are solar power and wind power.

[I] Solar power is all about harnessing the energy of the sun by using solar panels to convert sunlight into usable electricity. [II] Moreover, solar panels are perfect for installation on a small scale, such as in private homes, since they require very little maintenance and have a long lifespan. [III] However, the ability to generate solar power depends on the time of day and weather conditions. [IV] This means that solar panels are often less useful if they are installed in places where sunny weather is not typical.

Wind power involves converting the energy of the wind into electricity using large turbines. Wind power doesn't produce any greenhouse gases, but it is not ideal for private use since turbines require consistent care. However, wind farms can be installed on a large scale and are able to produce electricity continuously regardless of the time of day. This means that if there were more investments in wind power, it could be a viable way to provide energy for major cities and even for whole regions.

Wind and solar power contribute significantly to a green environment by reducing our reliance on fossil fuels, helping us cut down on pollution and slow climate change. Additionally, using renewable energy sources helps promote spending on sustainable development by creating new career opportunities in the green energy

For now, the biggest challenge of adopting green energy is the costs associated with installation and infrastructure, but the benefits unquestionably outweigh the downsides. If we want to stop the climate crisis and create a better and more sustainable future, green energy sources will undoubtedly be the key.
