steel cylinder or by spraying them into a chamber through which a current of hot air passes. In the first case, the dried material is scraped off the roller as a thin film which is then broken up into small, though still relatively					
coarse flakes. In the second process it falls to the bottom of the chamber as a fine powder. Where recognizable					
pieces of meat and vegetables are required, as in soup,
