**Nature Makes You “Feel More Alive”**

With all of these benefits to being out in nature, it’s probably no surprise that (18) \_\_\_\_\_. In Sydney, Australia, supermarkets brim with food products from around the globe, catering to the city's multicultural population. Shoppers can pick up South African Rooibos tea, Indian Maharaja's Choice sauces, Indonesian Bintang beer, or British Mars Bars. For the homesick, products such as Polish Wawel sweets or Solidarność chocolates line the aisles. Sydney's restaurants reflect this diversity, serving dishes from Afghan to Zambian cuisines, appealing to both specific ethnic groups and the city's curious general public. This remarkable variety reflects trends in global migration and trade. Australia, where 40% of the population are first-generation migrants, demonstrates how movement of people shapes markets. Other countries, like Switzerland, may host fewer international migrants but still experience internal migration, with people moving between cities for work. Meanwhile, global trade policies have made international goods more accessible. The World Trade Organization's **push** for zero tariffs has reduced costs, while improvements in transportation—faster ships, better roads, and affordable air travel—have sped up the process of moving goods worldwide.

[I] However, recent studies suggest supermarkets could go further in catering to local demographics. [II] For example, if 10% of a store's shoppers are Vietnamese, 10% of the products should reflect Vietnamese tastes. [III] While specialty shops exist for minority communities, many still rely on mainstream supermarkets. [IV]

Research by Bart Bronnenberg and David Atkin highlights the **enduring** power of brand loyalty, which is often tied to childhood experiences. Migrants, for instance, tend to continue purchasing the brands they grew up with, even if these are more expensive than locally-produced alternatives. Bronnenberg's analysis of 38,000 U.S. families revealed clear regional brand preferences, even among people who had moved interstate decades earlier. Atkin's research in India confirmed **this** but also uncovered the role of internal tariffs, which keep locally-produced goods cheaper, even as imported options become widely available. These findings underscore the need for supermarkets to align their inventories with the preferences

of their diverse customer bases. **While global options appeal to many, emotional connections to familiar brands often outweigh advertising and pricing strategies.** For supermarkets serving immigrant populations, understanding this dynamic is key to fostering customer loyalty and meeting community needs.
