LESSON 3A: VOCABULARY – FILMS AND TV PROGRAMMES

I. OBJECTIVES:

By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

1. Knowledge:

- Understand and can distinguish many types of TV programmes and films
- **Vocabulary:** films and TV programmes, action film, animation, chat show, comedy, documentary, fantasy film, game show, horror film, musical, news bulletin, period drama, reality show, romantic comedy, science fiction film, sitcom, soap opera, talent show, thriller, war film, weather forecast, western, confusing, convincing, gripping, imaginative, spectacular, unrealistic, violent, acting, ending, plot, scenes, script, soundtrack, special effects, etc.

2. Ability:


