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Nellie Bly's real name was Elizabeth Cochran Seaman, and she was an American journalist and writer, known for her great contributions to investigative journalism and advocacy for women's rights. She was also famous for completing the fastest trip around the world.

Born in 1864, Nellie Bly started her career in 1885. She was once **rejected** from jobs just because she was a female journalist. However, Bly didn't give up. Finally, she got a job in the New York World by **pretending** to be suffering from serious mental issues to enter a mental asylum for investigation. Her series of articles exposed the harsh conditions and the mistreatment of patients. Her work helped create significant improvements in mental health care.

Inspired by Jules Verne's famous novel *Around the World in Eighty Days*, in 1889, Bly was determined to travel around the world. Many people thought it was impossible for a woman to do it, but she finally beat the fictional record of 80 days and accomplished her feat in just 72 days, which set a new world record.

Throughout her career, Bly tackled various social issues, including the different kinds of **hardship** faced by female factory workers and their daily struggles. She utilized her writing as a platform to fight for women's rights.

Nellie Bly's contributions revolutionized investigative journalism and left an enduring impact on the field. Her fearless determination and commitment to exposing the truth continue to inspire future generations of reporters. Bly's work not only brought attention to the mistreatment of the mentally ill and led to reform but also proved the power of storytelling to cause crucial social change.

Born on October 23rd 1940 and raised in Brazil, Pele's passion for football started at an early age. Even though his family was too poor to afford a football, he began playing football using a sock stuffed with paper. His father had been an excellent footballer before he **quit** to look for another job because in the 1940's professional footballers were very low-paid jobs. Therefore, Pele learnt lots of skills from his dad and spent time practicing football anywhere he could in his small town. By the age of fifteen, he started playing football professionally for Santos, a football club, and quickly became popular nationwide. Pele made it on the Brazil national team at the age of 16. His acrobatic bicycle kicks and lightning-fast reflexes became his signature as **they** both helped him earn the title of "The King of Football." As a result, Pele helped Brazil win three World Cups in 1958, 1962 and 1970. In 1978, Pele was awarded the International Peace Award for his work with UNICEF. In 1999, Pele was named FIFA's "Co-Player of the Century," along with Argentine Diego Maradona.

During his illustrious career, Pele's impact on the game was unparalleled for over two decades. After his retirement, Pele continued to be a role model of a great footballer and a source of inspiration for all young footballers in the world. He died on December 29th 2022 and left a great legacy for the future generations.
